Meeting Minutes of June 7, 2022

Opening: A regular meeting at The Oaks Restaurant & Lounge, Continental Country Club was called to order at 9:15 a.m. by President Mary Anderson who welcomed everyone then led us in the Pledge of Allegiance. Three guests introduced themselves and several members were welcomed back after long absences. June and July birthdays were announced. Mary passed the Happy Box with \$19 being collected.

<u>Program/Speaker</u>: Member Doris Field is an active Advocate with **Guardian ad Litem**. She introduced Recruiter Amarilys Ortega who serves in Sumter County and spoke to us about the organization and its purpose of advocating for neglected and abused children. As part of the Justice System, advocates are appointed by judges to speak up for the child's needs in the courtroom and in the community. The program is funded by each county and the state. Both Amarilys and Doris spoke anonymously of cases they have been involved in, their time commitment and personal rewards for making a huge difference in the lives of those otherwise voiceless children.

Voices For Children is a not-for-profit 501(c)(3) created to help meet the unique and often critical financial needs of the children assigned to the Guardian ad Litem (GAL) Program. Additionally, they support the recruitment, training, and retention of Guardian ad Litem volunteers. Voices For Children provides money to spur-of-the-moment caregivers for clothes and food for the child that had to be removed from their harmful living situation; funding for critical medical and dental treatments, for developing their personal interests such as sports equipment, scouting and cheerleading uniforms, music and art supplies, etc. Definitely an organization worthy of our consideration to support.

Business Meeting:

- Community Service Adopt-A-Precinct program. All volunteers have been contacted by the Supervisor of Elections office and have begun training for their assigned positions. Laura noted that the depth of the training program may be a bit overwhelming, but that during the actual polling hours there is always someone to help you just raise your hand.

<u>New Business:</u> As a result of the May club meeting about Civitan and other issues addressed at the May Board of Directors meeting, decisions were made as follows:

The Oaks on 44 is the permanent location of Hometown Civitan Club monthly meetings.

<u>To help</u> defray the club's cost of the breakfast at the monthly club meetings, **annual dues** will be increased \$25 **effective October 1**st, **2022 to \$175.00**, due and payable in the month of October. (If

- Every first-time guest gets her breakfast free (sponsors are encouraged to treat/pay).
- The member who brings a friend who joins the club, gets her next breakfast free (honor system).
- The member who brings in three (3) new members within the same fiscal year will receive \$50 off her next annual dues.

Next Club Meetings & Programs: Because of the convention, there is no club meeting in July.

<u>August 2</u> – Beacon College in Leesburg - The first accredited college offering four-year degrees designed around the needs of students with diagnosed learning disabilities.

<u>September 6</u> – Presentation of our annual charitable grants and Business Leader of the Year award to Diane Hintzen, manager of Evelyn & Arthur, for her fundraising efforts that benefit PACE and Ruth House.

October 4 – Florida District Governor Bonnie Ruth will install our club officers for 2022-2023.
